



# Could you rank in order how often people have asked about the following topics on Reddit or other forums in the past two years? 1. Attachment style differences

(secure vs. anxious, avoidant, disorganized)

People often describe push-pull dynamics and want to know if those patterns can work long-term.

## 2. Core values differences

(religion, politics, worldview, class background, wealth expectations)

Questions usually revolve around whether differing belief systems will eventually create conflict.

## 3. Life goals

(children vs. no children, marriage expectations, long-term lifestyle)

(existing children, parenting style differences, step-parenting dynamics)

#### 10. Differences in relationship or sexual experience levels

Often raised later in life when one partner has had many relationships and the other few or none.

#### 11. Significant age gaps

Usually tied to life stage, power dynamics, or family planning timelines.

#### 12. When the other person is married

Questions tend to focus on whether a relationship can become legitimate or trustworthy.

#### 13. Location and lifestyle alignment

(whether one partner must move, rural vs. urban preferences, travel lifestyle)

#### 14. Sexual compatibility

(libido differences, sexual preferences, openness to experimentation)

#### 15. Political differences

Especially when tied to identity, social issues, or moral beliefs.

#### 16. Criminal history or past legal trouble

People sometimes ask about trust, safety, or future risk.

#### 17. STD status

Most questions center on transmission risk, stigma, and whether disclosure affects long-term viability.

#### 18. Severe or terminal illness

These questions tend to focus on caregiving expectations and long-term emotional impact.

A useful way to group them

18. Severe/terminal illness - Caregiving burdens rare, very personal.
